

**APPLIED MECHANICS DIVISION – HAYTHORNTHWAITE FOUNDATION
RESEARCH INITIATION GRANTS**

With funding from the Haythornthwaite Foundation, the Executive Committee (EC) of the Applied Mechanics Division (AMD) of ASME is pleased to announce the establishment of the Haythornthwaite Research Initiation Grant Program, targeting university faculty engaged in research in theoretical and applied mechanics that are at the beginning of their academic careers. Applicants must hold a tenure-track appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor at a US university on October 1, 2012, and must not be more than 5 years beyond receipt of their doctoral degree at the time the award is made. The intent of the grant is to assist with the purchase of equipment or instrumentation, fabrication of a unique apparatus, travel, or other items that serve the proposer's research objectives. The applicant is expected to complete at least a portion of the proposed effort within one year of the award and report the results as an oral or poster presentation at the following IMECE.

This year, three awards in the amount of up to \$20,000 each will be funded by the Foundation. These will be matched by one more award from the AMD for a total of four. Awards will be made by the AMD EC based on the evaluation of a short technical proposal (2 pages, max.), the budget, and CV (2 pages, max.). Indirect costs may not be included in the budget. Proposals will be due by August 24, 2012, and should be emailed as a single PDF file to: amdhayth@mail.ae.utexas.edu. This email address is for proposal submission only; there will be no reply to inquiries emailed to this address. The PDF file should be named "lastname_firstname_MMYYYY", where the 6-digit number "MMYYYY" is the month and year that the applicant's doctoral degree was awarded. The CV should also include the month and year that the doctoral degree was awarded as well as the applicant's expected academic rank on October 1, 2012. The font size used in the technical proposal and CV should be 12. Proposals not containing the degree date and academic rank on October 1, or not in compliance with the page limits, specified font size or single-PDF-file rule will be disqualified, and proposal files not named in the format specified may be lost.

The Robert M. and Mary Haythornthwaite Foundation supports scientific research, primarily research in the field of Theoretical and Applied Mechanics.
