Aaron Tsang is the Chief of the Airworthiness Engineering Department at Bombardier Aerospace in Toronto, Canada. He is responsible for aircraft certification for the DHC-8 (Dash 8) family of aircraft, as well as managing potential safety related issues by assessing the level of safety risk and identifying the need for corrective actions. Aaron started as an intern at Bombardier back in 1996 and upon graduation, rejoined Bombardier at the end of 1998. He progressed within the company from a Junior Engineer position to become the Lead of the department in 2002 and has been in the Chief role since 2004. He graduated from the University of Toronto with a B.A.Sc. degree in Mechanical Engineering.

He is currently a member on the District B Operating Board, Ingersoll-Rand Competition Judge, as well as the Young Engineers Chair for the Ontario Section.
