



CALVIN W. RICE AWARD LECTURE **INSTRUCTIONS FOR NOMINATORS**

The nomination package should include the following:

1. A letter from the principal nominator addressing how the nominee meets the criteria, for the award.
2. Supporting letters from a minimum of three references of familiar reasons why the nominee should be considered for this award.
3. Curriculum vitae of the nominee listing educational and professional background, awards, publications, and other information, pertinent to the nomination.

These materials should be solicited and assembled by the principal nominator.



NOMINATION FORM

CALVIN W. RICE LECTURE AWARD

ASME established the Calvin W. Rice Lecture in 1934 to honor ASME's longtime secretary, Calvin W. Rice. It's intended to further his goal of promoting understanding among engineers. It honors special achievement in mechanical engineering by an individual who, preferably, is neither a United States citizen nor a permanent resident of the United States. He or she will present a lecture at an ASME event of the nominating Technical Division's choice. The lecture will be included in the official event's proceedings or will be published separately.

The award consists of an ASME Life Membership, a \$2,500 honorarium (in lieu of travel expenses) and a certificate.

The Technical Communities of the Knowledge and Communities Sector administers the Calvin W. Rice Lecture Award. Nominations for this prestigious award will be reviewed and a Lecturer selected by a committee composed of TC Honors Committee by the Chair of the Calvin Rice Committee and two past vice presidents and/or TC Technical Group Leaders.
