Allen Bieber was presented with the ASME Fellow Award at the 2009 Joint Rail Conference – an extremely prestigious award that was well earned by this veteran GE locomotive mechanical engineer, and former RTD Chairman, who continues to serve our railroad industry with his many talents.

2009 JOINT RAIL CONFERENCE An Excellent Learning Opportunity

The ASME 2009 Joint Rail Conference, held March 4-5, 2009, in Pueblo, CO, immediately following the AAR Annual Research Review, was a great success. The conference was sponsored by three technical groups, ASME Rail Transportation Division (RTD), the ASCE Transportation Development Institute, and the IEEE Vehicular Technology Society. The conference theme this year was, "Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Improvements in Rail Technology."

JRC 2009 had a total of 111 attendees and 41 papers and technical presentations. Technical sessions were well attended and included: Railway Civil Engineering Structures, Mechanical Component Reliability, Computer Modeling, Rail and Track Inspection Technology, Truck Design and Performance, Energy and Fuel Conservation, Advances in Wheel Research, Truck Design and Performance, passenger and Freight Structures and Crashworthiness, Operations and Train Control, and Railway Electrical Engineering Research.

The conference opened with remarks by keynote speaker Roy Allen, President of TTCI and the conference dinner speaker was Michael Iden, General Director of Locomotives for Union Pacific Railroad, who provided an overview of issues related to "green" locomotive technology.

The 2009 JRC Technical Tour included a tour of the Pueblo Chemical Weapons Destruction Pilot Plant in Pueblo, CO, and a visit to the Emergency Response and

Training Center (ERTC) at the Transportation Technology Center, Inc. A live demonstration of a simulated tank car derailment and fire was staged for the RTD tour attendees. Additionally, tour attendees heard a presentation on Positive Train Control at TTCI.

Our industry continues to see excellent JRC technical content when we bring together ASME, ASCE and IEEE. Congratulations to all organizers, authors, speakers and attendees for making JRC 2009 another fantastic success.

CALL FOR PAPERS & PRESENTATIONS

2010 Joint Rail Conference HIGH-SPEED AND INTERCITY PASSENGER RAIL

University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, Illinois, USA April 27 - 29, 2010

JRC 2010 is a cooperative effort of the five sponsoring organizations and will be the principal, multidisciplinary, North American conference focused on rail transportation next year. The conference will be held 27-29 April 2010 on the campus of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in Urbana, IL 140 mi, (225 km) south of Chicago, Illinois, U.S.A..

Papers and presentations are being solicited on <u>all aspects</u> of railroad civil, mechanical, electrical and systems engineering, as well rail safety, planning, design, financing, operations and management. Both <u>freight and passenger</u> rail subjects will be included, but the conference theme will be high-speed rail (HSR) and other forms of developing intercity passenger rail. Topics we are encouraging submissions on include but not limited to:
